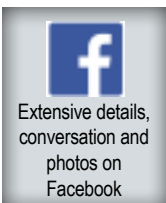

Promptings

“Why do you write?” From time to time, I get asked such a question by church members, young ministers, and others. It’s a fair question. Over the past few decades, I’ve written or co-written six books and numerous Bible studies, devotionals, and opinion pieces. To be honest, writing is hard work, especially when done in one’s “spare time.” Why do it?

I write because I believe I’m responsible to God for using the gifts and skills I actually possess in God’s service. In my case, this means using words to help others follow Jesus well. For me to refuse to write would amount to a dereliction of duty. So, I take up my pen (well, I sit down at my keyboard), and I write.

I write because writing forces me to try to think through how I might best follow Christ. When I write, I start to discover the gaps in my own understanding of what it means to be a Christ-follower and to wrestle with how to fill them. When all is said and done, writing is an act of self-exploration. For a Christian writer, it’s a way of discovering oneself and offering what one finds to God.

I write because I believe in the importance of words. What we say about God, the creation, others, and ourselves matters. Words shape perceptions, and perceptions drive actions. One of the Genesis accounts of creation depicts God speaking creation into existence. What we call the Ten Commandments are known as the Ten Words in Jewish tradition. The Sermon on the Mount consists of words chosen intentionally by Jesus. I write in order to force myself to use words carefully and I write in hopes of encouraging fellow Christians to do the same.

All of which leads to a question: How do you use your particular gifts and skills in service to God? Whatever they may be, I urge you to devote them to the service of God.
