Promptings

Kathleen Norris (*Amazing Grace: A Vocabulary of Faith*, pp.18-21) tells the story of a friend who realized the life path he was walking led only to destruction, left it, and took a new road. Her description of his subsequent feelings captures the experience of many.

Having turned, suddenly, from the path he was on, our friend seemed a bit lost but also glad that he had been able to name something as wrong, and to walk away from it. He had tasted a kind of freedom and wasn't sure what to do about it, except to tell the story. He felt good but uneasy, I think, unsure of what to do next. I could not have said this to him then, but accepting salvation is never easy. The Israelites, having been led by Moses out of Egypt, began complaining as soon as they hit the desert. "They said to Moses, 'Was it because there are no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us, bringing us out of Egypt?'" What God had done, of course, was to set them free from what had long held them in bondage. But they, as any of us might, began longing for the devil they knew, rather than face the unknown road ahead.

When we decide to walk the trail blazed by Jesus, we leave the road we know and strike out into new territory. We may have reports from earlier travelers and friends who have walked the road a little longer, may share some what they know, but in the end we must walk the road for ourselves. Feeling a bit uneasy is natural to the experience.

Walk the new road, anyway. Doing so is the only way to follow Jesus.
